### **Funding Submissions**

Like every other neighbourhood centre, GBNC is constantly keeping an eye on what grants are open and writing submissions.

In the past 3 months we have lodged the following submissions:

- Ergon Energy for training room technical equipment
- Celebrating Multicultural Qld Multicultural Projects to add to Driving Work Life Opportunities driving orientation for people from other cultures

### **Funding Submissions**

- Dept Communities Innovation Grant small for membership to online directory and diary.
- Dept Communities Innovation Grant large for a new 3-year program to tackle Ioneliness
- Gambling Community Benefit Fund for funds to hold a Volunteering Expo in 2024.

Fingers are crossed. Stay tuned in the next edition for an update on success or failure.

We also let 3 other Granite Belt agencies know of grants that seemed appropriate to their client base.

We were notified that GBNC was *unsuccessful* in its application to the Investing in Qld Women Grant Program.

However, we were *successful* in securing funds to hold 3 specific disaster related workshops from the Flexible Funding Grants Program small grants.

Other benefits to our community by GBNC Fair Play vouchers. GBNC sourced 75 vouchers from the Dept which provides \$!75 per voucher support with the costs of youth participating in some form of sport. The vouchers are per person NOT per family. This means that GBNC's enlisting for this program has saved a total of \$13,125 to residents of the Granite Belt.

Foodsupport boxes. This is an entirely volunteer funded service from GBNC. From 1<sup>st</sup> July until 30<sup>th</sup> Dec 2022, Foodsupport provided 243 boxes at average cost of \$50 per box. This means the Granite Belt community & volunteers have provided a total of \$ 12,150 in social capital within the past 6 months alone.

## Stanthorpe Hospital's Consumer Consultative Committee (SCCC)—update

Update on the work being done on the 3 priority areas the SCCC focuses on are:

 Information sharing on services and visiting clinics via the AccessMyHealth online platform. The subcommittee reviewed this platform and the existing service directory on the Darling Downs Hospital website. A decision was reached that the DD Hospital site was preferred as its up-to-dateness is maintained by them.

What was agreed was that GBNC would on a monthly basis, via its fb page, 'remind' residents of where to go and how to search for information about what services are available at the hospital and what are visiting clinics. GBNC also undertook to post any notifications received from the hospital regarding dates of visiting clinics. Since these postings began mid-January there has been nothing but positive comments on these posts.

- 3. Reimbursement for Chairperson role no longer an issue.
- 4.Mental Health on 25<sup>th</sup> Feb there was a garden party and ceremony to launch the new murals on the entrance walls to the Boulders. This was an initiative of Rotary Club of Stanthorpe. Well done, it looks fabulous.

## UPDATE - The service gaps GBNC is working on to bring onsite at the Granite Belt

GBNC team members are actively working on two known service-gap issues, especially onsite in the Granite Belt:

1.Face-to-face counselling for victims of a) sexual abuse or b) domestic <u>family</u> violence. This work is with the Toowoomba- based DVAC.

<u>Update</u>: This did not progress further as the demand for this service did not mean onsite was a viable service option.

2.Community transport both local and longerhaul to Warwick and Toowoomba, provided by STAR Community Services.

<u>Update</u>: STAR Community Services have established an office in Warwick and appointed Natalie Perritt, District Coordinator 0448895642. They cover the entire Southern Downs. GBNC will be setting up a meeting with Natalie to discuss how the Granite Belt transport needs can be progressed. Remember we are keen to link this work into the Stanthorpe Hospital Community Consultative Committee.

As the end of the yearly term for the members of the SCCC approaches rapidly work continues on continuing to progress the greater engagement being achieved currently between the Stanthorpe hospital and the Granite Belt Community.

## Emergency Relief in the Granite Belt update

On the 20<sup>th</sup> January, the planned 6-month review of the new way Emergency Relief is delivered in the Granite Belt occurred

All three agencies and the funding Department representative attended and each agency took it in turn to report on how things have gone for the first 6-months.

All three agencies reported increased demand for assistance of up to 25% increase for one agency.

Each of the agencies indicated the new way of working seemed to have no detrimental issues.

The only issue GBNC raised was its learning that having ER and Foodsupport 'on' at exactly the same time and day meant that people getting a referral at ER were not able to get their food box until a week later.

SO... the only change to the new way of working that was agreed was that GBNC from the 6<sup>th</sup> March 2023 would change its day from the Thursday of the week to the Monday of the week.

It was agreed by all parties that we would review our partnership way of working in another 6 months.

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### **Early Years**

Activities for parents and their children (prenatal to 8 years) for example, weekly Lego therapy and two Playgroups (Tuesdays and Thursdays).

#### Youth

Activities aimed at working with youth who are at risk of disengaging from school, family and/or the community.

### **Mental Wellbeing (PHN)**

Focuses on initiatives to improve individual and community response to mental health needs of any aged residents.

### Family Support Services

Assists vulnerable families to develop family/household management skills, improve life skills and provide information, advice and referral. During school terms Baby & Me runs for 5 weeks and is aimed at new parents.

### **Emergency Relief**

Available to assist on a time-limited basis with basic life needs and is available to any person/resident in the area including backpackers

### **Community Support Services**

Assists vulnerable individuals in an integrated way by increasing life skills, connecting people to the community, events, projects and resources to benefit the whole community.

### **Kids Korner**

Limited hours childcare for children aged 15 months to 5 years. Days of operation are Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Casual use is encouraged.

### **Driving Work Life Opportunities**

Aims to expand life options & employment through addressing the barriers that prevent persons aged16-25 years from obtaining a drivers licence. This program works with the PCYC's Braking the Cycle Stanthorpe program.

### **Sustaining Tenancies**

Available through GBNC for clients with tenancy-related issues. A realistic payment plan will be set up to come out of your Centrelink payments

### **Foodsupport**

Available weekly on a Thursday morning via a referral from GBNC staff. Clients are to attend our Food Support at 15 Hilton St 8.45am-9.45am only.
