We understand that not all our programs or activities will everyone either agree with or want to be part of.

We also respect everyone to have their opinion and to voice it.

PLEASE voice your facebook comments using respectful words.

You still get the message across if you simply say "I don't agree with this activity" or some such.

GBNC wants to continue the use of comments. However, should there <u>not</u> be a change in comments being framed in respectful language, we will turn off comments for all our posts.

Also, we will continue reporting the names of those posting any disrespectful comments to police every time.

GBNC works hard to be a place for everyone, including people using disrespectful words.

Granite Belt communities needs and wellbeing survey – happening for the month of March

GBNC's Community Support Service (CSS) during for the entire month of March will be conducting a needs and wellbeing survey within the Granite Belt.

The survey will be distributed widely and will be available to be completed online or on paper.

This will be the first needs wellbeing survey of the Granite Belt communities in a very long time, if ever.

We encourage each of you, regardless of age to complete it.

GBNC will make the report from the survey also publicly available to others. This is so other agencies can use the data in their submissions for new services or increases to their current program's funding.

Within GBNC this report will:

- inform what the focus of the CSS program coordinator's work
- shape what new programs GBNC may seek funding for
- encourage other agencies to deliver their services to the GB.

GBNC has kicked the year off with exciting news that finally the building work at Corundum Street commenced. While it has gone on for way much longer than Qbuild indicated it is almost complete.

We've closed in the hub area so there is now a definite training room and the outside verandah near the kitchen has had a door installed so we now have even more lockable storage area.

Rumour is we may be getting an automatic front door too!!

How much value has Fair Play vouchers given to Granite Belt?

GBNC's Family Support Service has for the past 3 years applied to the State Government to be supplied with Fair Play vouchers.

Fair Play vouchers are valued up to \$150 per child and can be used towards sport and active recreation membership, registration or participation fees with <u>registered activity</u> <u>provider</u>s. There is a limit of 1 voucher per child per calendar year.

Over the years the number of vouchers we apply for have climbed and we now have reached the maximum possible. There are usually 2 rounds per year to get vouchers.

In 2024, specific vouchers for swimming were on offer and GBNC sourced a number of them. These vouchers differ in age range eligibility and expiry timeframe to the Fair Play vouchers.

From this current round GBNC's receptionist, Nikki, has issued 116 Fair Play at \$150 each and so far, 24 Swim Start vouchers at \$150 each.

This means in this round alone GBNC has provided <u>a total of \$21,000.00 support to</u> <u>Granite Belt families and sporting clubs</u>.

Update – Improving transport access within the Granite Belt

GBNC was funded by the Primary Health Network (PHN) for a 1year project to improve access within the Granite Belt via community transport – that is local transport.

GBNC has been working with a community reference group and reporting on this project's progress to the Stanthorpe Hospital's Community Consultative Committee.

It's taken a while for this project to shape up.

2024 year started well with STAR recruiting a worker to be based in Stanthorpe 2 days per week.

However, the worker having accepted the job then resigned in the lead up to day 1 of work.

SO... its back to recruiting a staff member and to the GB communities waiting longer until we get this project off the ground.

Please bear with us. We are trying hard to put in place a new service that will continue in the GB beyond its initial funding.

Early Years

Activities for parents and their children (prenatal to 8 years) aimed at assisting effective parenting skills.

Youth

Activities aimed at working with youth who are at risk of disengaging from school, family and/or the community 12 – 21yrs.

Mental Wellbeing (PHN)

Focused on initiatives to improve families and children's mental health transitioning to high school.

Family Support Services

Assists vulnerable families to develop family/household management skills, improve life skills and provide information, advice and referral.

Healthy Ageing Support

Supports senior Southern Downs residents to live at home through enhanced social connections.

Sustaining Tenancies

Available through GBNC for clients who need a helping hand. A realistic payment plan is set up to come out of your Centrelink payments

Food Support

Available weekly on a Thursday morning via a referral from GBNC staff. Clients are to attend our Food Support 15 Hilton St 10—11am only.

Emergency Relief

Available to assist on a time-limited basis with basic life needs and is available to any person/resident in the area including backpackers

Community Support Services

Works in a diverse range of ways including community development aimed at increasing sense of connectedness and build community capacity.

Kids Korner

Limited hours childcare for children aged 15 months to 5 years. Days of operation are Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Casual use is encouraged.

Driving Work/Life Opportunities

Aims to expand life options & employment through addressing the barriers that prevent persons aged16-25 years from obtaining a driver's licence. This program works with the PCYC's Braking the Cycle Stanthorpe program.
