ANNUAL REPORT OF THE STANTHORPE FIELD NATURALIST CLUB INC. 1995.

The year has been one of variety once again, with plenty of challenges for outing leaders. In another year of drought we have had one outing cancelled due to rain and at least two others affected by rain either on the day or just before, making the road impassable. In spite of this we have had 13 outings which included three Environmental Days in the new Heritage Park, 2 campouts, one half day outing and 7 normal day outings. It is interesting to note that almost half of the outings were in New South Wales. These Field outings are different for each person attending, as we all have our own personal interests, be it in one of the Natural History fields, or simply as recreation from our daily activities. It is my hope that these interests have been catered for and I would like to sincerely thank the Outing Leaders for their efforts.

Our meeting programs have also been varied with travelogue slide shows from around Australia and overseas but I feel special mention must be made of the two Activity Nights; Gordon Davis' Quiz night and the meeting at Girraween soon after the disastrous fires of September, both gave members the opportunity to become involved. They were thought provoking and a lot of fun. Many thanks to all the Meeting Program Presenters.

A wonderful achievement during the year was the presentation to Jean Harslett of the 1995 Queensland Natural History Award. Congratulations Jean on receiving this very deserving award, and a special thanks to Tom Archer for compiling this very thoroughly researched nomination.

The involvement of our Club in the development of the Heritage Park has become an ongoing project. The receipt of a Grant of \$2800 from the One Billion Trees Program will enable the construction of a shelter to house interpretive signs for four native plant beds, and the purchase of plants. Work done by members has so far been voluntary but rewarding, with the clean-up of rubbish from the area up to and beyond the 'Red Bridge', the painting of the 'Little Red Bridge' and the construction of the "Heritage Park" sign. I'm sure the Park will be as enduring as the granite sign, and I feel honoured to have been involved in what has already become a great asset to the community.

The Learning for Pleasure Group has been meeting regularly through the year. Three Discussion Groups - French, Ancient History and Current Affairs have been conducted and will continue. Liaison Officer, Mary Walters, will welcome enquiries from anyone to join in. Thank you, Mary for your work in this role.

In concluding this report I must especially thank the committee members for their support and dedication to their tasks throughout the year. Thank you all.

OUTING REPORT - SUNDOWN N.P. - 23/7/95.

Some 30 (a good round number) people including very welcome visitors enjoyed a pleasant day at Sundown National Park on Sunday 23rd July.

We left Weeroona Park at approx. 9.00 am, arriving at Sundown in time for the proverbial 'cuppa'. (Nats can't exist without that cuppa!). We noticed and gave right of way to many kangaroos as we drove from Park Headquarters to the camping area. After the cuppa we followed the track to the permanent waterhole which appeared to have some more water in it than on the pre-outing in June, but the river is still not running. Some folk went some way up Ooline Creek while the majority went to the Permanent Waterhole. Exploring, chatting, photographing or just sitting drinking in the view from the rocky bank was done before lunch.

After lunch, most of the group crossed the river and walked up a vehicle track on the other bank to Red Cliff Waterhole. On the way we noticed many cypress trees with lichen attached to them - perhaps because of the fogs which probably stay in the valley, perhaps because of the moist breeze from off the water. Amongst the rubbish trapped at the base of one tree in a flood (what's that???) debris was an old, bottomless (where did that go?) galvanised milking bucket.

We noticed an ants' nest that had been attacked by an echidna. Lincoln bravely investigated a long snake skin hanging down a rock face. It was agreed that this was a very dead adder. We also noticed the Ooline Tree as well as the red ash tree. Ray, and others, retrieved a very old goat's horn from the river without anyone falling in - is it going to add to the feathers on that hat???





Conventional vehicles can reach the Broadwater camping area and the Severn River at the southern end of the park via 75km of bitumen road from Stanthorpe and 4km of good gravel road.

A graded shire road leads to the park's eastern boundary from Ballandean. A rough 4WD track leads to campsites along the river. Bushwalkers may leave vehicles just inside the park boundary at the start of the 4WD track.

To the north, a rough shire road leads from Nundubbermere Road to a Crown reserve above Nundubbermere Falls on the Severn River. The river may be crossed with care and good walking is available downstream.

Please care for Sundown!

To protect the natural beauty of Sundown, and to allow other visitors to enjoy the park, please:

- remove all your rubbish from the park;
- leave dogs and cats outside the management area;
- do not use generators, chainsaws or outboard motors;
- leave all plants and animals undisturbed;
- · take great care with fire;
- be careful about hygiene, and where there are no toilets bury human waste well away from creeks; and
- do not enter contaminated area around old mines.


PRE OUTING - AUGUST 20 - OUTING TO AZTEC TEMPLE

We will leave Weeroona Park at 9.00 am and travel via Sugarloaf Road, Eukey Road, Breens Road and Pyramid Road to the Paling Yard Road turnoff on the left. Though this road is not signposted, there is a Girraween National Park sign and a sign which reads "Park Headquarters 5km." Drive carefully to avoid rocks and ruts for about 1 km, where we will leave the cars. After 'smoko' we will follow a service road, taking the left fork past the feral pig trap, until we reach Paling Yard Creek. Along the way the more energetic members may detour to climb a rocky hill. Upon reaching the creek we will follow it downstream a little then climb the hill to view the rock formations which make up the Aztec Temple. We will have lunch here or back at the creek - there will be plenty of time to explore this area which has such a lot of interest in close proximity. The return trip to the cars will be along a different service road.

Except for the bit of uphill to the Aztec Temple and the rocky hill detour, which are not essential to the walk, I would rate this as an easy-paced Grade 1 outing.

The fires of last September have cleared most of the undergrowth, which makes for easier walking off the roads, however be prepared for some black marks on hands and clothing. Bring your binoculars and camera, as on the pre-outing we saw several kangaroos and three nesting birds, and remember that we have to carry lunch.
