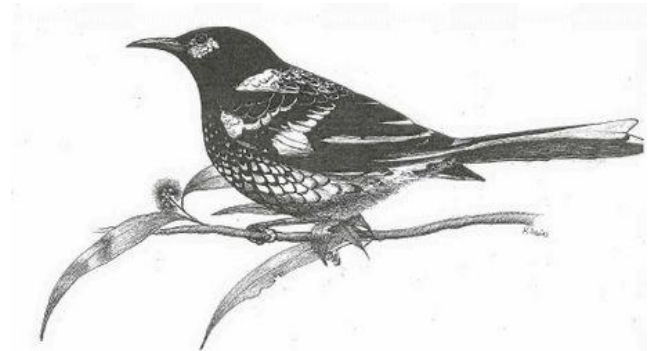
New England Regional Art Museum (NERAM)
