Category 3 STILL LIFE - also includes interiors, inanimate objects, botanical or similar. Any medium

1st Rebecca Berrett 'Found in Glovers' Paddock this Sunday Last'

The specificity is difficult, really different

2nd Anni Washington 'Arum Lillies'

Depth and breadth of medium, capturing beauty of plant.

HC Rebecca Conduit 'Native Flowers'

Really love it, though this is a personal thing – really beautiful – reminiscent of Margaret Ollley

HC Carmel Higgins 'Magnolia Stem'

Likes the choice of singular bloom – so gentle. Beautiful and beautifully framed.

Gorgeous botanical

Category 4 ABSTRACT/CONTEMPORARY - any medium

1st Rick Phipps 'Giraffe'

Really contemporary – has humour/is comical. Has depth and breadth with the way he's used the paint.

2nd David Raynolds 'Bearded Dragon'

Specifically really amazing – likes use of contemporary colour, quite stunning.

HC Glen Caisley 'Coastal Wash'

Very different – feel like I'm in the depths of the ocean. Really beautiful.

HC Theo Gard 'Fire at the Gate'

Really drawn to heat. Done so well with heat behind the gate – levels of colour, quite strong and brave.

Category 5 DRAWING (where mixed pigments are not the dominant means of expression) - any subject

1st Rebecca Berrett 'Grey Butcherbird & Dynastine Beetle'

Has specificity. Likes the way the bird has been portrayed – no background, eye on beetle. Quirky, really interesting. 2nd Judy Harris 'Sheepish'
