SCALE OF DIFFICULTY FOR WALKS ON NATS OUTINGS

- 1. Flat walking, road or track
- 2. Road or track, gentle hills
- 3. Track, some hilly sections
- 4. Track, some steep sections
- 5. Cross country, easy open forest, gentle slopes
- 6. Track, steep sections common, with steps
- 7. Cross country, some hills, some thick undergrowth
- 8. Cross country, steep sections with scrambles over rocks, etc., and some thick undergrowth
- 9. Cross country, steep, hilly, rough, thick undergrowth
- Mountain climbing, hard going, higher level of fitness or plenty of time required

Pre-Outing Report Peak to Creek 19th August 2018

Leader: Kris Carnell



We will meet at Weeroona Park at 9.00am. Four wheel drives will be needed for the day so we will work out the transport before we leave. The drive to our first stop will be via Eukey Road, Breens Lane and Pyramids Road before turning into Mount Norman Road. At the first access point of the trail, we will leave a vehicle or two before driving up to the Paling Yard Creek crossing for morning tea.

We will then continue along the Mount Norman Road to the day use area to start the walk. The outing will be a one way walk from the day use area along a shared bike/walk trail to the first access point. According to a ranger that I spoke to, the trail will show three different stages of vegetation management. The left hand side

has been unburnt for a number of years. The first section of the right hand side was burnt two years ago and the second section was burnt last month. There were a few wattle trees flowering in July but I don't expect much else because of the dry. I estimate the walk to be about 7 km. When we reach the cars left at the first access point we will have to ferry some drivers back to pick up their vehicles. Carry your lunch and water.

Outing Report – Amiens State Forest – 22nd July 2018

We had a very nice day for the walk – sunny and not much wind. We collected two more people at Amiens then reduced the number of cars and parked in the state forest. We walked around 11kms on roads and rough tracks.



Adunca wattle was just starting to bloom and we saw and smelt some shrubs that were ahead of the others. We stopped at two homestead sites. One had only a chimney left and it was dated 14921 (in its concrete). The second site had plaques on some rocks about members of the Sealey family.

We passed the hill where the old fire lookout was. The track is now hard to find and the tower has fallen (or been taken) down. We had lunch on a big open rock with great views across farmland and the hills to the North and West.

One member showed us the tracks/diggings of echidnas, goats, pigs, deer, cats and a very big dog. We heard lots of birds but they proved difficult to sight.
