SCALE OF DIFFICULTY FOR WALKS ON NATS OUTINGS

- 1. Flat walking, road or track
- Road or track, gentle hills
 Track, some hilly sections
- 4. Track, some steep sections
- 5. Cross country, easy open forest, gentle slopes
- 6. Track, steep sections common, with steps
- 7. Cross country, some hills, some thick undergrowth
- 8. Cross country, steep sections with scrambles over rocks, etc., and some thick undergrowth
- 9. Cross country, steep, hilly, rough, thick undergrowth
- 10. Mountain climbing, hard going, higher level of fitness or plenty of time required

Pre-Outing Report – Wyberba – 25th August 2019

Leader Jeanie Wylie.

Sorry but there is a change to the planned event. The outing will now be to a private property at Wyberba. The walk is off track and along the creek with some climbs to lookout rocks with good views. There is a waterfall but it and the creek are dry. Although off track it's not very difficult terrain. The property owner will take us around. There are usually many wildflowers but no guarantees with the drought. Pack morning tea and lunch.

Meet as usual opposite the police station at 9.00am. For those who live south of town please be at or close to the used furniture business located on the left as you turn from the New England highway into the road to Girrawean NP. (Pyramids Road).

Pre-Outing Report -Black Rocks Campout - 2 to 6 September 2019

Leader: Geoff Campbell

Black Rocks is 25 km south of Woodburn, approximately 25 to 30 minute's drive. The individual campsites are set in the bush, screened from each other. Each site has a fireplace, table and seats and a clothesline. A long drop toilet is located each end of the campground and another about in the middle. Water and firewood have to be brought in with you. The Jerusalem Creek water is unfit for drinking due to possible feral pig contamination. Motel and hotel accommodation is available in Woodburn if any non-campers are interested. Birds and wildflowers should be in abundance.

From Woodburn turn south for approximately 2 km and turn left into the rest area access near the start of the road works, turning immediately right at the T-junction. Follow through to the end on to Gap Road. The southern entrance to Gap Rd is permanently closed. The initial section of this road is bitumen, the remainder gravel. Follow the well-used gravel road to the campground.

NSW Parks currently have a stay 3 nights pay for 2 deal. To get this deal you need to pick a site from the online campground map (Google Black Rocks campground NSW) and then ring 1300 072 757. Vehicle access fees are additional to the camping fee. The northern access to the beach is still closed due to storm erosion.

Outing Report - The Junction - 21st July 2019

The outing to The Junction in Girraween NP attracted 13 members on a perfect winter day. We met at the Picnic Area for morning tea then walked along the Junction track observing the sad state of the bush in the extreme drought. We noticed many Orange gums, *Eucalyptus prava*, were so distressed all their leaves were brown while some Stringybark *E.youmanii*, were putting out epicormic shoots along their trunk and had lost most leaves from their canopy. Where the track passed through low shrubs of wattle and she-oak, growing on shallow rock shelves, the vegetation was completely dead. Upon reaching the granite slabs of the Junction there was



a trickle of water running only as far as the cascade pool whereas on my pre-outing trip just 10 days before water was trickling well below the junction with Ramsay Creek.



We stopped for lunch then nine of us continued for some distance downstream through some pretty rough scrub to avoid the boulders in the creek bed. At one spot we passed a clump of White Mintbush, *Prostanthera nivea*, which looked healthy and still had the remnants of flowers from its last blossom. I was surprised to see the extent of Spinifex growing along the creek bank having only seen it in a couple of isolated spots previously. When we reached the bend in the creek where it turns north we decided to turn back to the lunch spot then continue to the cars for afternoon tea and the end of a pleasant day.

The drought, bushfires and controlled burns had a marked impact on our programme this past year, although given the conditions there were a surprising amount of wildflowers on some of our field trips. We had two camp outs cancelled due to weather conditions, one too dry and the other because of a bushfire. In August Kris led us from Creek to Peak in Girraween and he and Margaret took us to the Flinders Ranges at the meeting. September saw us climbing Mt 'Patti' with Holly followed by Central Australia with Rob and Trish at the meeting. October's field trip was to Girraween and we learnt a lot about beetles from Gunter at the meeting.

November saw us driving Spirabo Forest Way to Drinkwater, returning via Stannum, under the leadership of Trish and Rob. Kris and Margaret took us to Canberra and the Floriade and Cowra. The December breakup was held at Kris and Margaret's place. Guntur took us insect collecting around Bookookoora and showed us more Australian insects at the meeting. The March field trip was swapped to June and the trip to Goomburra was cancelled due to inclement weather there. Rob showed Stanthorpe and surrounds at the meeting.
