

## SCALE OF DIFFICULTY FOR WALKS ON NATS OUTINGS

- 1. Flat walking, road or track.
- 2. Road or track, gentle hills.
- 3. Track, some hilly sections.
- 4. Track, some steep sections.
- Cross country, easy open forest, gentle slopes.
- 6. Track, steep sections common, with steps.
- 7. Cross country, some hills, some thick undergrowth.
- 8. Cross country, steep sections with scrambles over rocks etc., and some thick undergrowth.
- 9. Cross country, steep, hilly, rough, thick undergrowth.
- 10. Mountain climbing, hard going, higher level of fitness or plenty of time required.

## Outing Report - Wallangarra Ridge

Only 7 starters fronted for the 24<sup>th</sup> October walk to Wallangarra Ridge from Castle Rock Camping area via Turtle Rock. The small number was attributed to either the distance (10-12kms) or the weather or a combination of both. Following the heavy rain and the hail of the previous night, the day dawned with a promising break in the West and a moderately optimistic weather report from the ABC at 8.00am. Apart from a small shower as we approached Wallangarra Ridge, the day was fine, the tracks were in good condition, the rocks comparatively dry and the going underfoot when bush bashing surprisingly good, all told good walking conditions.

The little wildlife we saw included 3 Wedge-tailed eagles, an odd lizard, a wallaby, some Crimson rosellas at Castle Rock Camping area and a mob of kangaroos which have taken up grazing there. However, there were stacks of wildflowers in bloom with over 60 species being recorded.

By chance, I returned to the same area 6 days later and was surprised at the change in flora in that period. Whereas the stars on the first trip were Dodonaea (hop bush) and Boronia, on the second it was Prostanthera and a wide range of colourful peas.

My thanks are due to Jean Harslett and my son, Ian, in assisting with the identification and to support from Sue Kenna.
