

- 6. Track, steep sections common, with steps.
- 7. Cross country, some hills, some thick undergrowth.
- 8. Cross country, steep sections with scrambles over rocks etc., and some thick undergrowth.
- 9. Cross country, steep, hilly, rough, thick undergrowth.
- 10. Mountain climbing, hard going, higher level of fitness or plenty of time required.

1. Photocopier

Kris has discussed the new billing arrangements with Samson Total Technology and has also investigated other options for a replacement photocopier with Downs Office Equipment. He estimates that a replacement copier would cost approximately \$2,000 and that we should investigate funding options such as the Community Benefit Fund.

Outing Report:

Col Hockings reported on the trip he led to the Billy Goat Hill area of Girraween National Park on 22 July. Twelve people went on the outing which climbed an unamed hill SE of Billy Goat Hill and then returned to the cars via Billy Goat Hill. A beautiful sunny winter's day with great views of the rest of the park. Quite a few flowers were out including wonderful displays of *Acacia adunca* and *Mirbelia* but few birds were sighted. The group returned via Wallangarra and saw a good display of blue mountain daisies beside the Mount Norman carpark.

The August 19 outing will be to Red Rock in Sundown National Park, led by Peter Haselgrove. It will require 4WD vehicles to access this section of the park.

July Outing Report Girraween- An unnamed hill SE of Billy Goat Hill

A total of 12 people attended the outing. The weather was perfect- fine, a few clouds for the photographers and a comfortable temperature for walking.

Following morning tea, we departed from the vehicles at the locked gate at about 10 to 11. The National Park service road had recently been slashed making the walk to the crossing of the un-named creek, very pleasant.

At this crossing we left the road and headed cross-country, reaching the intended rock outcrop at about 20 to 12.

Everyone was delighted with the flower show which greeted us. The outcrop was encircled by Acacia adunca and Mirbelia sp., both of which were in full flower.

After exploring the area and enjoying the view to Mt Norman, Twin Peaks, The Pyramids, Billy Goat Hill, Bald Rock and West Bald Rock, we had an early lunch in the lee of the crest of the bare rock area. Following lunch, Dave Bright was the only member to accept the challenge of the tricky scramble to the top of the slightly higher peak about 300m south of our lunch spot. The struggle was rewarded with a good view of West and Middle Bald Rocks.



As it was still early afternoon, Errol suggested that we return via Billy Goat Hill. Along the way we passed a freshly used burrow which, Liz suggested, may be used by a wombat.

On returning to the vehicles it was decided over afternoon tea, to return to Stanthorpe through Wallangarra. Enroute we paused to view a small patch of Blue Mountain Daisy (Olearia ramosissima) which was in full flower. Other flowers observed during the outing were Acacia ulicifolia, Prostanthera sp., Leucopogon, Phebalium, another low growing Acacia and Banksia spinulosa.

Outing 19th August To Red Rock Area

The August outing is to the Red Rock area in Sundown National Park. We will meet at the gate into the National Park from the Ballandean end at 9.00am. Allow ½ hour from Ballandean village.

Morning tea will be at the Red Rock picnic area. We will be able to wander down to the lookout where we'll be able to look across the gorge to our lunch destination. The walking track to the edge of the gorge was upgraded some time ago to a good standard and the National Parks have constructed a viewing platform. There is also a toilet at the picnic area.

After smoko we will continue further along the Sundown Road to the halfway hut. We will leave our vehicles here and walk about 1 ½ km to the edge of the gorge. The walk will take us through both trap rock and granite country. Lunch will be on the edge of the gorge across from the viewing platform. After lunch and the usual exploration of a new area we will return to the vehicles via a different route, and then make our way home.

Obviously lunch and water will have to be carried. The trip will require 4WDs, but Peter says that Foresters and Rav4s etc should be okay. There are some spare seats available, so if you require a lift please contact Kris Carnell on 46835268 as soon as possible.
