- 6. Track, steep sections common, with steps
- 7. Cross country, some hills, some thick undergrowth
- 8. Cross country, steep sections with scrambles over rocks, etc., and some thick undergrowth
- Cross country, steep, hilly, rough, thick undergrowth
  Mountain climbing, hard going, higher level of fitness or plenty of time required

## **Pre-Outing Report – The Signboard – 24<sup>th</sup> September**

September 24<sup>th</sup> outing will be to the "signboard", Girraween.

We will meet at Weerona Park at 9am, proceeding via Eukey, Pyramids Road turning left into Mt Norman Road and drive 1 km to the locked gate. (conventional cars ok). Smoko can be taken here.

Carrying lunch we will head south along the kept fire trial, crossing Bald Rock Creek and soon after some easy bush bashing to the "Aztec Temple". Time to explore before returning to Bald Rock Creek and possibly the Underground River, where lunch could be taken. The ascent of the Signboard will be cross country up a gentle grade (1 in 10) to the summit, with an easy descent back to the vehicles by about 2pm. Total trip would be 6 km with 120m of climb, mainly grade 2 up to a small amount of grade 8 on the climb. Those wishing not to scale the hill can return via the fire trial.

## **Outing to Tully Park – Friday 6<sup>th</sup> October 2006**

We will meet at Weeroona Park at 9.00am and travel to Tully Park to look for orchids. Bring morning tea.

## Report on Outing to Rivertree Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> August 2006

As promised at last year's May outing, we took up Mac and Gilruth Rees' offer to explore their property to the east above Koreelah Creek. A similar sized but different group (Total 22 =17 SFN and 5 visitors) fronted a still-frosty Stanthorpe morning. In all, 8 or 9 mainly high clearance 4wd's convoyed east along Amosfield Rd, over the border and down the Rivertree Road to its end. On meeting our hosts, we moved along 'the M1' to stop at Koreelah Creek for smoko and introductions.

The creek banks are lined heavily with flood shaped Water Gums and Bottlebrush, and despite similar waterhole levels last time, no platypii seen in this section.

Moving on, we chose to ascend Mac's M3, which climbs the side of Rivertree Peak to the East. Partway up we paused at the 'grasstree forest', where early flowering stalks were attracting native and honey bees. This section is typical of the more open north and west facing slopes, dominated by Apple, Ironbark and Kangaroo grass, in contrast to the steeper or Southern facing slopes we could see across the gully. These tend to support taller 'wet' scherophyll forest with a larger variety of gums including some Bloodwoods, Tallowwoods, and many Brush Boxes.

Geology (and subsequent soil) also has a big influence on vegetation variation. Granite on the lower slopes (edge of batholith) gives way to sedimentary layers, capped with volcanic soil. Further up, outcrops of volcanic basalts are evident in a rock scree.

Rounding a spur, we continued along a ridge to the N.E. where Mac has recently refered a section dividing the upper 'plateau' like hilltops. At the cattleyard we turned S.E. following his new fence, where Rees' ute was bailed up by a large (2.5m) Carpet Python. With a line of eight 4wds not everyone got to see it before it disappeared into the long kangaroo grass. Where this spur terminates (drivable) we stopped for lunch. Around us several pea bushes and creepers and one logania became obvious. A short walk down slope to the south led to a knoll/cliff-top overlooking Cullens Creek and the Upper Clarence beyond.

This outcrop seems to be composed of a lighter (scoria-like) fine-grained volcanic rock, which features some unusual vegetation :- leafless(deciduous) Coral trees, Fig, Correa, Plectranthus, Acacia Granitica?, Waxflower(Hoya) and Wonga vines.

Returning to the cars we backtracked to the cattleyard, briefly sidescurting to the N.E. corner with abundant pea (pultenea) and Sago bushes beginning to flower. From here our Brisbane visitors were able to take a short cut (through Tooloom) home.

The rest of us returned along the 'M3', Gilruth offering some the option via cyanide rock and down Koreelah Ck. Thanks go to Mac and Gilruth for another excellent day on the property and special thanks to those providing seats in their 4WD's.
