Some may have noticed my name appears in an article on the Girraween web site run by the Ryans of Brisbane (<u>http://www.rymich.com/girraween/</u>) By way of background Vanessa Ryan has been in contact with a number of local people about the content of the site and is now interested in developing the invertebrate content. She was surprised that there was no list of insect species for the Park (which is not surprising to most entomologists).

I had already had ideas of trying to collate the already known records and am developing a database to put this material in. I also have an idea of specific sources and suggestions of others from Geoff Monteith of the Queensland Museum.

Pre-Outings

Sunday 19th July 2009. The July outing will be to a patch of rainforest on Rokeby Station, north of Dalveen on the Old Warwick Road (Mountain Park Road), with a possible afternoon excursion to Elbow Valley, depending on available time.

Meet at Weeroona Park at 9.00am, travel to Dalveen and then follow the Old Warwick Road for about 14km to an entrance gate on the western side of the road, opposite the entrance to "Daybreak". We will meet the group at that point. From there some of the route is cross-country so it would be advisable to car pool into higher clearance vehicles. It is only a short distance to the start of the walk from there.

We will have smoko at the parking point, thence examine the rainforest, walking through it up onto the ridge and back down a power easement. There are stinging trees and vines and small bushes with thorns, so wear long trousers and long-sleeved shirts.

We can return to the cars for lunch and those who wish to can depart, while the rest of the group can go on to walk into Elbow Valley a little further along the Old Warwick Road. P&C Smallwood.

Friday 7th **August.** Our outing will be to a property on Grienke Lane which is off Horan's Gorge road. We will meet at Weeroona Park at 9am and travel to the property. After morning tea at the cars, we will walk to a large rock which looks down on the mushroom farm in Watters road. The circuit walk then continues back to the house where we can have lunch.

The property was devastated in the 2002 bush fire destroying a partly constructed house. It will be interesting to observe how the bush is regenerating. Last year there were some white boronia plants in flower in early August and we had hoped to see them this year. Unfortunately with the unusual weather conditions, they have started flowering already so we'll just have to wait and see. I'm sure there will be other wildflowers coming into flower on the day. Bring your morning tea and lunch. The owners have a ritual of eating an apple or having a drink at the rock so come prepared. For more information contact Kris or Margaret Carnell on 46835268.
