- 9. Cross country, steep, hilly, rough, thick undergrowth
- 10. Mountain climbing, hard going, higher level of fitness or plenty of time required

# Outing Report:- Hush' Property August 7th



It was a beautiful early spring day, when the Nats travelled to Greinke Lane for our outing. The property we were visiting is owned by Vic and Lyn Hush and is on the eastern side of the highway off Horan's Gorge Rd. We arrived at our meeting point to be met by Vic and a couple of members who had travelled direct. After gathering our backpacks etc., Vic took us up a track to their house which is only accessible by high clearance vehicles. As we walked up the hill we could clearly see the after effects of the terrible fire in 2002. The wattle is quite thick and was flowering as was some sarsaparilla. The house is situated on the top of the hill with beautiful views and is designed as an eco-friendly house and generates its own electricity.

Before smoko we went a short distance from the

house to look at the little white *Boronia anethifolia* which had nearly finished but there were enough to get some good photos.

We were thoroughly spoilt for smoko with Lyn and Vic providing damper, jam and hot water. After smoko we walked south along a newly constructed fire trail to the southern side of the property. At our first stop, we saw some very nice specimens of the Blue Mountain daisy *Olearia ramosissima* and we were able to identify a *Dendrobium caniculatum* for Lyn. We then walked east for a short distance to a large flat rock where there were good views to the South over Eukey Rd and towards Ballandean. There were quite a number of early spring wildflowers growing around the rocks. There were also quite a numbers orchid leaves in evidence and it could be

worthwhile arranging another visit at a different time of the year.

Some of our members left to return to return home at this time and the rest of us had our lunch enjoying the view and the company. After a while we made our way to the cars at Nats pace. It was a very pleasant outing and we thank Vic and Lyn very much for allowing us to visit their property. *Kris Carnell*

# Outing Report: Kitchen Cave, Roman Road, and Slip Rock; Sunday 23rd August

Eight keen walkers met at Weeroona Park at 8.00am and were joined by two more en-route to Girraween

We set off at 20 to 9. On the way to the saddle behind the Second Pyramid, we passed 3 Lyre bird display mounds, two of which were freshly worked over. A break was taken for morning tea on a rock slab which gave a good view of the back of the Second Pyramid and other peaks in the distance including The Sphinx. We all suffered and passed the squeeze test on reaching the boulder outcrop close to Kitchen Cave. The "test" is to fit sideways through a narrow crevice that leads to a gloomy cave. Kitchen Cave was enjoyed and the



surrounding enormous boulder pile thoroughly explored before moving on, climbing the bare outcrops leading up to the Roman Road.

Being a reasonably clear day, peaks along the Main Range, Mt. Superbus, Wilson's Peak, etc. were visible in the distance. Lunch was taken at the top of Slip Rock overlooking Bill Goebel's property. Bald Rock

was prominent in the distance. Adjacent to Slip Rock a cream coloured shrub caught the eye of some of us. It was in full bloom and showed potential as a garden plant. Subsequent investigation showed it to be *Acacia myrtifolia*, an uncommon wattle.



After lunch we retraced our steps to Kitchen Cave where we had a relaxing break in the cool air of the "cave". On the return journey, Alec Harslett led a small group on the very challenging climb up the Second Pyramid. The remainder of us took a break and watched their progress before descending to the vehicles which we reached at about 20 to 3.
