Wildflower Walk Sunday 21st September2014

Location: Passchendaele State Forest (Northern Section - TV Tower Walk 9.30 - 12.30)

Directions: From Stanthorpe, drive for about 12km and turn right into Bapaume Rd. Follow Bapaume Rd for about 8 km and turn left into Passchendaele Rd. Follow Passchendaele Rd to the TV tower. Park along the road, but well off the road so that traffic can still pass.

The Nats will have lunch after the wildflower walk and then Michael Meuller will lead us on another short walk.

Horans Gorge Outing Report – 24th August 2014

The outing on Sunday 24th August to Horans Gorge attracted 19 people including two from Brisbane who had been wanting to visit this park for some time and so were happy to join us.



We drove to Baldwin's property at Fletcher where Tom Dunn was waiting for us, then continued along the track to the park boundary and set off on foot. Tom showed us an enormous Kurrajong tree, *Brachychiton populneus*, which was easily mistaken for a eucalypt by its trunk. It had survived the extreme bushfire of October 2002 and had lost all trace of charred bark so that it looked more like a box, but the leaves confirmed its identity. Further along the gorge we also saw the gaunt remains of a huge exotic pine tree, probably Radiata, which was once quite a prominent marker, but it did not survive. Perhaps we

should give thanks for small mercies, as we saw no pine tree seedlings either.

We stopped for

morning tea at a rocky spot on the creek, which had no flow, however a couple of small waterholes had tadpoles. A brief search under the rocks here turned up two different geckos and a small skink. Neville Bryant was able to tell us

he used to ride his horse through the gorge from his home at Eukey when he was young, and that a number of wild horses had been rounded up from the gorge to be used at the Stanthorpe Rodeo. The gorge is named after a chap who lived in a shanty there for some time and had a small area of cultivation, and before that there was some mining activity by Chinese tin miners.

As we continued along the gorge we passed through a stand of Paper-bark trees, *Melaleuca alternifolia*, which I was pleased to see, had also survived the bushfire, though not as well as the Kurrajong. We were soon near the head of the gorge and had to watch our step to avoid stepping on



Greenhood orchids. After scrambling up the gully coming from the south we looked at a large fern we had seen on the pre-outing which turned out to be a ground fern, not a tree fern as I had thought.

Another plant nearby was thought to be *Pittosporum undulatum,* but has been identified as *Myrsine variabilis* a rainforest remnant called Muttonwood. Some people continued up the gully as far as the fence line while Carol and I climbed the ridge to the east, where we caught a glimpse of

Ballandean and found masses of Sarsaparilla flowering profusely.

We all returned to the gorge and followed the ferny gully coming from the north a little way before stopping for lunch. A number of the group then decided to continue up this gully to see where the track we had found on our pre-outing trip, led and though it took a little longer than they hoped, they finally returned to tell us they had ended up on top of Mt Dillon. We then retraced our steps back to the cars for a cuppa before heading home. I would like to give a special thanks to Tom Dunn for his help with this outing.

Flowering plants -

Acacia venulosa Veiny wattle, A. adunca Wallangarra wattle, A. neriifolia Granite silver wattle, A. pruinosa Frosty wattle, A. ulicifolia var. brownii Prickly moses, Correa reflexa var. reflexa Common correa, Hardenbergia violacea, False sarsaparilla, Notelaea linearis, Narrow-leaved mock olive, Dodonaea falcata Hop bush, Hovea graniticola, H. heterophylla Trailing hovea, Pomaderris lanigera, P. nitidula Mountain pomaderris, Leucopogon melaleucoides Snowbush, L.muticus, Lomandra leucocephala ssp leucephala Wooly matrush, Melichrus urceolatus, Urn heath, Patersonia glabrata Wild iris, Pterostylis curta Blunt greenhood, P. nutans Nodding greenhood, Acritriche aggregata Tall groundberry, Pimelea novaeanglica Poison pimelea, Cryptandra amara var. floribunda, Myrsine variabilis Muttonwood.

Ferns-

Adiantum aethiopicum Common maidenhair fern, Asplenium flabellifolium Necklace fern, Doodia sp. Rasp fern, Blechnum cartilaginium, Gristle fern, Hypolepis glandulifera Downy ground fern, Cheilanthes distans Shaggy rock fern, Davallia pyxidata Hare's foot fern, Pteridium esculentum Common bracken fern.

I am sure this is only a small sample of the variety of ferns to be found in this interesting place.


