Book Group

Our book of the month was *The Handmaid's Tale* by Margaret Atwood. It was written in 1984 but it is still relevant today. It is a dystopian tale set in the future. The setting is the north eastern states of US, called Gilead in the book.

A drop in the fertility rates of the citizens has resulted in a take over by the right-wing religious fundamentalists. Men are back as the top group in the population. Women are put into their rightful place, according to Old Testament teachings. The women are not allowed to read or to have a bank account. They are totally dependent on the men. Within the women there are the wives, the breeders, the servants, the wardens (called "the aunts") and the old women who are sent to contaminated sites to clean up the waste, which is usually nuclear. This is a death sentence for the older women.

The main protagonists are Offred, a breeder and Fred, a Commander and his wife Serena Joy. Offred is a fertile woman and a servant belonging to Commander Fred and his infertile wife. Every month at her fertile time, Offred must submit to the Commander who, in effect rapes her. If a child results from such a union it becomes the child of Fred and his wife. (The fertile women become the property of the drområne

Commanders, hence their title)

Canada is not affected by this regime and many of the Gilead women and some of the men try to escape across the border to Canada.

It is a disturbing book, with such a bleak future portrayed but despite this, it is an interesting and easy read.
