Garden Report

The group visited Peter Burnell's Spring Creek Seedling Nursery. Peter began his working life as an electrician. His work took him to nurseries so he decided to start his own, so from small beginnings, he built his present mostimpressive set-up. Peter grows seedlings on contract for vegetable growers, one grower, Rugby Farms takes 120,000 seedlings a week. They draw up a program for the season and Peter grows the small the seedlings.

The operation starts with sowing the grower's seeds in trays filled with a seedling mix of pine bark, coir and peat moss. These are placed in a germination room at 17 to 18 degrees until the seeds germinate. Once germinated, the seedlings for \$3.00 are taken to the 1ha greenhouse to be grown and hardened. Hygiene is essential and pests and diseases are monitored closely. No insecticides are used, predatory insects are released into the greenhouse to control aphids and other pests. Peter also grows strawberry runners in high hydroponic troughs where the runners cascade down, then separated and

planted into seedling trays to form strong strawberry plants.

Peter has a roadside stall where the public can purchase 10 vegetable plants for \$3.00

Bolivia Station was settled in the 1840s. It was named by Bolivian migrants as the area reminded them of Bolivia. The present owners, the Bulmers purchased the property as a working farm in 2011. The house was in a derelict condition when the property was

purchased.

Fran Bulmer decided that she would use the homestead as a venue for patchwork weekends and tours of the homestead. Some of the rooms have beautiful pressed metal ceilings that have been cleaned and repainted. Some of the carpets in the house date back at least 40 years and they are still in good

condition.

The group moved into the banquet



room where a sumptuous morning tea was laid out on a wool classing table that had been in use for its original purpose until 2 years ago. The table has been given a glass top. Many thanks, Fran for a very interesting and informative tour.
