U3A Garden Group enjoyed their Christmas breakup in Sam and Grace Costanzo's shady garden, at Golden Grove Winery, Ballandean.

Their home was built by Sam's parents in 1955: they have since made many improvements. The present garden was originally a vegetable patch.

In last year's severe drought many established trees died and were cut down but some like the *port wine magnolias* survived. The *poplars* on the Western side of the driveway died but the *oleanders* on the Eastern side survived and looked magnificent. Some of the large oleanders were planted 55 years ago – it's a reminder of the connection to Sicily.

We went for a walk around the garden to see new roses blooming and their *bougainvillea* flowering, Sam's vegetable garden was still producing vegetables and the *olive trees* had a great crop showing.

We thanked Sam and Grace for giving up their time and showing the Garden Group their garden.

Genealogy

What better choice for the genealogy group than a trip to Glengallan Homestead. If you are like me, I have been saying for years 'I must go in there one day'. Well, delay no more.

We had a lovely walk around the grounds and house which easily filled in over an hour reading info, reminiscing and dreaming of a time long past. The house is a tribute to the volunteers who brought it back from the brink and to those who have worked the property over the years.

The Leslie brothers originally claimed the run in 1841-42. They sold it to brothers, Colin and John Campbell who named it Glengallan Run. The famous merino flocks were established by Charles Marshall and John Deauchar who also grew commercial lucerne.

There were grand plans for a homestead drawn up by Deaucher but financial difficulties and bad seasons forced the sale of the unfinished homestead and property to William Ball Slade. Slade was a great cricketer and the homestead was a centre for Downs social life and cricket.

The homestead was gifted to the Anglican Church in 1949 who leased the land and allowed the homestead to be used as shelter for goats and birds. Many of the fittings were removed or stolen.

Since 1983, UQ Department of Architecture has worked with National Trust Grants at restoring, conserving and documenting the homestead.

The Glengallan Trust was established in 1993 and is maintained by many dedicated volunteers.

We also enjoyed a tasty light lunch in the cafe. Highly recommended!
